Ashini Sheoran, a student of the IBDP program at World School, actively Goenka is participating in the IBx Initiative alongside supervisor Sofia May from Indonesia and Aliza Fattani, an IB graduate student from the UAE. The IBx Initiative involves a two-month process of resource collection to support students in their chosen subjects. Recognizing the challenges of existing resource-sharing platforms like Reddit, which lack proper classification and are flooded with promotional content, the team has introduced Quester, a digital content curation tool.

Through Quester, they are building the largest IB library ever created, encompassing study guides, exemplar IAs/EEs, core resources, YouTube videos, past papers, and question banks for every IB subject. The aim is to address the problem of content overload on the internet by curating and organizing these resources in one accessible place. By doing so, the IBx Initiative seeks to provide a centralized platform where students can easily access the resources they need to excel in their IB studies. Through their curation efforts, they hope to contribute to solving the challenge of resource accessibility and enhance the learning experience for IB students worldwide.










Beads and Brains
